POST CONVENTION CRUISE INTERNATIONAL YACHTING FELLOWSHIP OF ROTARIANS CALGARY CONVENTION, CANADA

Banff, Lake Louise & Jasper

June 26 - 28

Day 1: June 26

This morning you will be picked up from the hotel to enjoy a sightseeing tour of Calgary and hear about the history, art, and culture that defines the city.

You will see the Stampede Grounds, Stephen Ave, and the Downtown area. Enjoy a guided tour inside Studio bell, the Calgary Tower, photo stop at Calgary Public Library and the Peace Bridge, before we drive west past Canada Olympic Park and head to the foothills to arrive into Banff National Park.



The town of Banff is at the center of Canada's very first National Park. Nestled high in the Canadian Rockies, the town is located within the Banff National Park. Once "Siding 29" on the Canadian Pacific Railway, the town was intended to be a tourist town from its inception.

Upon arrival, there will be a tour of the town of Banff including Tunnel Mountain, Hoodoos, Bow Falls, Cascade Garden, and the famous Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel.

Enjoy free time to explore on your own followed by a guided tour of the Buffalo Museum and the Cave and Basin.



Next, you will experience the Banff Gondola as you sit back, relax, and marvel at the unsurpassed view of Banff, the Bow Valley, and a 360-degree view of six scenic mountain ranges from 2,281m (7,486 ft) above sea level. Dinner will be served at a mountain-top restaurant to enjoy overlooking Banff in the Canadian Rockies.

Enjoy free time this evening to explore on your own.

Overnight: Banff Meals: Dinner

Day 2: June.27

This morning the group will arrive at Lake Louise, which is best known for its turquoise glacier-fed lake ringed by high peaks. See the famous and picturesque lake and the Chateau that overlooks it.

Enjoy time for a walk by the lakeside before we drive along the famous Icefields Parkway, voted as one of the most spectacular drives in the world. See why this mountain road boasts a unique landscape rich in history and its natural beauty is so famous.

Enjoy a quick picture stop at Peyto Lake. Before arriving into Jasper, we see the powerful Athabasca Falls before arriving at the charming town of Jasper.

Originally a tiny railway town, Jasper's small-town charm is very different from the alpine resort glamour of Banff. Surrounded by towering mountains, clear lakes, and abundant wildlife, Jasper is located within Jasper National Park, a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site. We start the day with a walk down Maligne Canyon to see how the water has carved spectacular crevices out of the mountain.



A scenic drive eventually takes you to Maligne Lake, the largest natural lake in the Canadian Rocky Mountains. As we continue deeper into the valley we drive into the sub-alpine forests and view the expanding ranges of limestone rising out of Medicine Lake. This mysterious disappearing lake changes seasonally as the flow rates of melt waters fill and empty this basin. A stop is made to photograph this natural wonder. From Medicine Lake, we continue through the forest which is a prime habitat for moose and bears. Sightings are common but not guaranteed as we try to see these animals in their natural habitat.

Today's journey takes us through 45 km of the most spectacular scenery anywhere in the Canadian Rockies. The scenic drive finally brings us to beautiful Maligne Lake, the largest natural lake in the Canadian Rocky Mountains.

We will take a leisurely 90-minute cruise on the lake and a short walk on legendary Spirit Island. Dinner will be enjoyed lakeside before returning to the town of Jasper for time at leisure.

Overnight: Jasper Meals: Breakfast, Dinner

Day 3: June.28

This morning, we return to Calgary. Dropping off at the Calgary International Airport.

2024 GRANTS AWARD

As previously announced by IC Angelica Mesistrano, the total grants allocation for 2024, in accordance with our General Rules, is set at **US\$30,000**. This amount will be proportionately distributed among applicants from our three Areas based on membership statistics.

International Treasurer Annette Lewis has reported that the Fellowship currently has 3,445 members in good standing, distributed as follows:

- Area 1: 1,629 members (47% of the total membership)
- Area 2: 654 members (19%)
- Area 3: 1,171 members (34%)

Accordingly, the Grant allocation is as follows:

But at first, the delegates were hospitably welcomed by the local Maritime Museum where special program was waiting for guests. The supervisors of the event have organized a meeting with the legendary sailing yacht "Ikar", the boat which during hard Soviet times has made a round-the-world voyage in 1989.





Moreover the National Post Office of the Ukraine has issued a special series of stamps, envelops and post cards dedicated to the five year anniversary of the IYFR Ukraine that was celebrated these days and the solemn cancellation of postage stamps was also held in the house of Maritime Museum.

In cause of the substantive AGM session the reports and proposals from the Fleets Commodores and Squadron Captains were heard. All the delegates were united in the decision that in conditions of war it is necessary to continue to support sailing schools of Ukraine that many of them were affected by rocket attacs.





The next informal AGM day was devoted to visiting sailing schools and meeting with young students. And finally in gratitude the children have performed an amazing sailing boat show for their patrons in so limitedly allowed water area.

With the yacht STARY 2015 as skipper he guided the Narwik-Spitzbergen-Camp, where they honored Polish Victims 75 years after the battle of Narwik.







TOP IYFR MARINER, EVER

Admiral Giuseppe Cavo Dragone, Pino for Rotarians and IYFORIANS, (Honorary Member of the Italy NW Fleet and RC Novi Ligure D2032) is the leading figure of the Italian Armed Forces, known for his most brilliant career.

In January he will assume the role of NATO Military Committee President.



He was first of his Naval Academy Class when graduated in 1980; then he attended the US NAVY Flight Schools, qualifying as a fixed wings and helicopters Naval Aviator. After intense operational activity also in the war zones, he returned to the USA where he qualified as a Jet Pilot, the first in the Italian Navy. Has been the first Aircraft Squadron Commander on the Aircraft Carrier Garibaldi and her Captain a few years later.

He later held numerous top positions such as Commander of the Navy SEALS, Commander of the Naval Academy (where he hosted us for an official IYFR visit in 2012), Italian Naval Forces CiC, Chief of the Naval Air Forces Department.

After being the Commander of the Joint Operational Forces, he 2019 he was appointed Chief of Naval Operations and, from 2021 to 2024, Chief of Defense, the highest military position in Italy, assuming the Command of the four Italian Armed Forces.







He is one of the main promoters of the development of the aeronautical capabilities of the Italian Navy, contributing to the introduction and integration of the most advanced aircrafts. During his service, he participated to several international Operations, always demonstrating leadership of the highest level. He played a key role in modernizing the operational capabilities of the Italian Navy and is a top expert in maritime strategy and joint forces operations.

Our Honorary Mariner, admired and appreciated by everybody, has always been committed in enhancing human resources and distinguished for his strategic vision of national defense and security.

Comandante in Capo della Squadra Navale e successivamente Comandante delle Forze Aeree della Marina Militare, è stato poi Comandante del Comando Operativo Interforze. Nel 2019 è diventato Capo di Stato Maggiore della Marina Militare e dal 2021 al 2024, Capo di Stato Maggiore della Difesa, il massimo incarico militare in Italia, assumendo la guida delle quattro Forze Armate Italiane.

È stato tra i principali promotori dello sviluppo delle capacità aeree della Marina Militare Italiana, contribuendo all'introduzione e all'integrazione dei velivoli più avanzati. FLOTTE CÔTE D'IVOIRE The zero plastic initiative a step towards a clean and sustainable Aghein Telegraphe

The "Zero Plastic" initiative took place on 28 September 2024 at Aghein Télégraphe, in the sub-prefecture of Brofodoumé, Côte d'Ivoire. Organised by the Côte d'Ivoire Fleet, under the direction of Fleet Commodore Marthe Rabbiosi, in partnership with the Agence Nationale de Gestion des Déchets (ANAGED), this operation aimed to combat plastic pollution, a major problem affecting ecosystems and the quality of life of local populations.

Nearly 200 residents and volunteers got down to work in the morning to clean up the village. The emphasis was on raising community awareness of the dangers of single-use plastics and the need to sort and recycle. Collection points were set up and supervised by the Comité de Gestion de la Salubrité, which was inaugurated during the event.

The support of the Regional Commodore for Africa, PDG Sunny Akuopha, and other partners, such as FACI and the Ministry of Health, was crucial. According to Marthe RABBIOSI and her peers, the 'Zero Plastic' initiative marks a concrete step towards a cleaner environment, with sustainable waste management solutions. As well as cleaning up, teams informed residents about the importance of reducing plastic use. By the end of the day, a significant amount of waste had been collected, transforming the appearance of the village. The Fleet Commodore highlighted
